On Friday of last week, salary arbitration in MLB ended when Ryan Zimmerman of the Nationals reached a one-year, \$3.325 million contract agreement. At the time, we reported on [some "vital stats" on this year's salary arbitration class](#), including the fact that salaries for the 111 players rose 143 percent from last season, mid-point agreements were up significantly from the year prior, and that the players beat the owners in salary arbitration hearings for the first time since 1996.

But, that was only a sliver of the details.

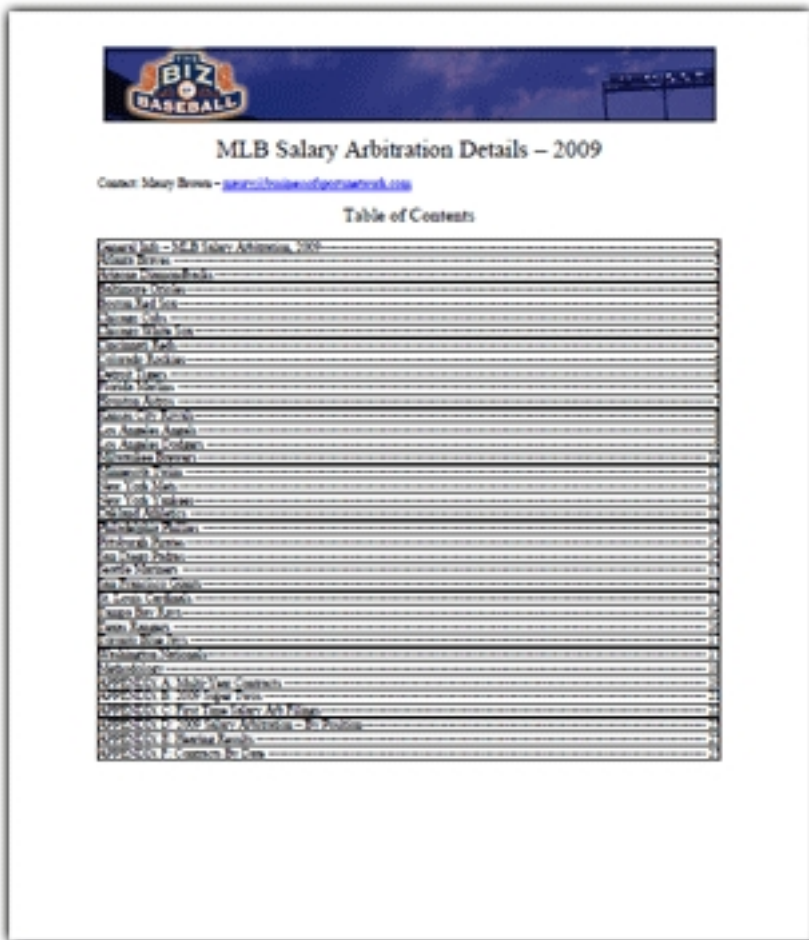
